Big Ideas are the building blocks of subjects. They are: -

- Concepts and ideas that helps us make sense of lots of otherwise isolated or disconnected facts.
- Principles, theories, or processes that serve as a focal point of a subject.
- Something that changes the way a we think about information or schema.

The big ideas in this subject are: -

<b>Big Idea</b>	<b>Description</b>
<b>Geographical Skills</b>	A range of key skills including; OS map skills, interpretation and analysis of sources and numeracy skills.
<b>Social</b>	The role and impact of people the physical and human environment. This will be studied on a local, regional, national and global scale
<b>Economic</b>	The impact of jobs, money and business on people and society at a range of scales.
<b>Environmental</b>	The way the environment impacts upon people and hoe people can impact upon the environment at a range of scales.
<b>Processes</b>	The geographical changes in physical features and human activity over time.
<b>Formations</b>	Explain how processes create both physical and human features.
<b>Interactions</b>	Geographical connections and relationships between the physical and human world.
<b>Sustainability</b>	The ability of society to meet the needs of today without preventing future generations from meeting their own needs.
