Broadwater Approach to Assessment

Formative Assessment

- Teachers will deploy a number of T+L strategies to assess how well their class are doing
- These strategies will be taught through the CPD program and include techniques like, cold call, circulate, MWBs, choral response and exit questions

Summative Assessment KS3

- Classes will take assessments at the end of topics and in line with the assessment dates as per the assessment calendar. These assessments will largely take place in lesson and will often be marked by students in the class.
- The outcomes of the assessment will be recorded as a percentage figure which will be reported to parents
- Once the data has been collected the average and highest percentage score will be shared with the parents on the report
- The assessment will cover knowledge and skills covered in previous topics
- There will be one formal exam week per year where some core exams will take place in the hall
- Assessments are both accessible and challenging and should include a significant proportion that is accessible to all students and a proportion that provides a level of challenge
- Teachers are asked to take in consideration a student's SEN and offer extra time or adjust the overall mark where necessary

Summative Assessment KS4

- Students will sit past papers (or parts of papers) and be marked in line with GCSE assessment criteria
- Teachers will report a Current Working grade (CWG) in Bromcom to be reported to parents
- Teachers will not report a grade 9 to ensure students always feel like there is more they can do
- Papers should be modified to ensure that students are only tested on content that has been delivered in class
- CWGs should only be generated based on components that have been taught and assessed i.e. if there are 2 papers for the subject and only one paper is sat, the grade boundaries should be adjusted
- Teachers are asked to take in consideration a student's SEN and offer extra time or adjust the overall mark where necessary
